Choice is NA

Chief's party leads, likely to form Govt

THE Governor-General is likely to invite the political party that returned the largest number of elected MPs over the weekend to form Government.

Electoral Commissioner Andrew Trawen was confident early this week he would call into Government House today to advise the Head of the State to do that but only 58 seats were declared as at 9pm last night, compelling commission staff to pick out the weekend as the likely time for the appointment with the leader.

They ruled out that being done on Monday as that is the deadline for the return of writs.

NA looks set to be invited by the Governor-General to form the next government but rumblings have already begun over its use of public assets to further its cause.
