Two camps emerging, **NA vs PNG and New Generation parties**

FIFTY-five is the magic number on the minds of political parties as their henchmen crisscross the country to woo newly declared MPs to join them.

The ruling coalition led by the National Alliance Party (NA) drew first blood yesterday morning when it whisked independent Kokopo MP-elect Patrick Tammur and Rabaul MP and Melanesian Liberal Party leader Dr Allan Marat to Wewak, East Sepik Province in the Governmentowned Kumul aircraft.

Angoram MP and Public Enterprise, Information and Development Minister Arthur Somare was on hand at the Government Flying Unit at Port Moresby's Jacksons Airport after 9am yesterday to ensure the two East New Britain MPs got on the plane.

Mr Tammur and Dr Marat did not turn up at a planned meeting in Port Moresby on Tuesday with Lae MP and New Generation Party (NGP) leader Bart Philemon and were accompanied to Wewak
